MESSAGE FROM OUR PARISH PRIEST

Today Our Lord is baptised by John in the Jordan. Many Church Fathers comment that by this act, He 'sanctifies the waters'. This means that today Christ gives water the incredible power to sanctify. Just think how amazing that is. If you pour water and say the words, then the Holy Trinity dwells in a person!

Baptism does a supernatural work. However, water has many astonishing natural properties too.

Eric Metaxas wrote a book called 'Is Atheism Dead' in 2021. In this book, he has a short chapter on water and its amazing properties. I only have room here for one of these. Metaxas points out a remarkable modern discovery about water's relationship with the sun.

Single celled organisms, algae, in the sea are essential to life on earth. They turn sunlight into energy, a process called photosynthesis, so they need seawater to transmit sunlight...something we take for granted...

The sun emits an enormously wide spectrum of electromagnetic energy. The spectrum is actually so wide that, if a playing card represented one type, you would need a line of cards that stretches from earth to beyond the Milky Way to the next Galaxy, the Andromeda. Sunlight represents just a few of those cards. Fortuitously, 70% of the suns energy that it emits, falls within that range of a few cards.

Seawater absorbs almost all of that vast spectrum. Except for sunlight. In an amazing coincidence, water allows sunlight to pass through it. In the deck of cards that spans to the next galaxy, sunlight is two or three cards, which happens to be 70% of the energy the sun emits and basically only what water transmits. This allows biological life, like single-celled algae, to live in the sea.

Anyway, to give that a theological interpretation: By the water of baptism, may the light of Christ penetrate our innermost being and give us life.

REFLECTION

Feast of The Baptism of the Lord

Anyone present at the Baptism of a child or an adult, can see clearly the love shared between those present. This child or adult is certainly loved and has now become the "beloved of God."

Jesus presented himself to John the Baptist for his own personal Baptism. Luke writes that Jesus heard, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him". Was Jesus surprised to realise this and so left to spend time alone to ponder what this meant for him, for the future? When he returns after being tempted to think of himself, not God's work, he begins to gather his disciples around him and teach them. He has now begun his mission, a mission that would lead to crucifixion!

Each of us is called, through our Baptism, to be disciples, to share this mission. I need to continually ask myself: "What is the mission I have through my Baptism?"

Let me listen to God's voice, the voice of the loving Father.



NICENO-CONSTANTINOPOLITAN CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.

ENTRANCE PROCESSION

After the Lord was baptised, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered:

This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.

FIRST READING Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

'Console my people, console them,' says your God.
'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.'

Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

SECOND READING Titus 2:11-14, 3:4-7

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self-restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good.

When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.
