EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION

20th April 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Resurrexit sicut dixit! Alleluia! The Lord has risen, as he said! Alleluia! (Mt 28:6)

Happy Easter to you and your families. I pray that Christ, risen and alive, has made His presence known to you this Easter. I pray that no matter the crosses you are bearing at the moment, you are filled with hope and consolation today. May the joy of the three Mary's and the Apostles upon seeing the Lord alive, be yours this day.

Allow me to share just a couple of thoughts with you on some pertinent passages of the Easter story:

"On the first day of the week, at the first sign of dawn, the women went to the tomb with the spices they had prepared." (Lk 24:1)

No one was present when He rose from the dead. Just as no one was present at creation when He said, "Let there be light", He rose from the dead in the silence of the early morning and without fanfare. Reflecting on His independence should fill us with awe and fear and humility. It reminds us that, 'God is God and I am not!'. And yet everything He accomplished He did out of love for us. He afterward appeared to Mary Magdalene and the Apostles, and has since made Himself known to each of us. This should fill us with awe and love, joy and gratitude for the love He has for each of us. Even today what is He accomplishing in the world, and our lives, without our knowing it? Let us trust in Him and pray that His will may be done.

"On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." (Jn 20:19)

Have our 'doors' been shut in some way to God? Don't be afraid to let Him in. Christ is alive and when we let Him in, he will bring peace to our souls. Much of prayer is simply the effort of remembering in our quieter moments that He is truly with us. Christ is alive and present to you, and you have His loving company.

"the tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many." (Mt 27:52,53)

The joy of the Resurrection is seeing our loved one, Jesus, alive after we had seen Him die. The joy of the Resurrection is the hope of seeing alive loved ones who have died - spouses, parents, brothers, sisters, friends, saints of old. Who could describe the joy of such an experience!? Well, that very experience is waiting for all of us thanks to the victory of Christ's resurrection. Christus Vincit! Happy Easter to all.

— Reflection —

Easter Sunday – Year C

German Philosopher Nietzsche commented: "If you want me to believe in your redeemer, then you've got to look a lot more redeemed". Some who profess themselves to be Christians believe, mistakenly and sadly, there is no place for fun or joy in religion.

The Exultet, sung at the Easter Vigil, has several images that "help us name our joy: freedom from slavery, an end to fear, the triumph of life over death and God's utter fidelity to Jesus, God's Son". We know that we have not earned this love, but God loves us out of God's own goodness. We process into the Church proclaiming, "Christ our Light". "Thanks be to God". As the reader proclaims, "This is the holiest of nights". The candles are lit, the lights fill the church and it is time for joy. This joy flows over to the Sunday readings when Peter and John visit the tomb and come to realise that Jesus is ALIVE! They must have run back with such joy to tell the others.

A priest going blind was asked how could he appear so calm in the face of coming blindness! He replied, "You know in the Gospels where the disciples are sent to Galilee to meet the Risen Lord? Well, I think I am being asked to go to blindness, and there I will meet the Risen Lord in a totally different way." Where will you meet the Risen Lord?

SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION – YEAR C

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

FIRST READING Acts 10:34, 37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household:

You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.' Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself; and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand.

Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM 117:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

R: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.'

The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up. I shall not die, I shall live and recount his deeds.

The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone. This is the work of the Lord. a marvel in our eyes.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 5:6-8

You must know how even a small amount of yeast is enough to leaven all the dough, so get rid of all the old yeast, and make yourselves into a completely new batch of bread, unleavened as you are meant to be. Christ, our passover, has been sacrificed; let us celebrate the feast, by getting rid of all the old yeast of evil and wickedness, having only the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

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GOSPEL ACCLAMATION 1 Corinthians 5:7-8

Sequence

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise.

The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb;

and Christ, the undefiled,

hath sinners to his Father reconciled.

Death with life contended: combat strangely ended!

Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign.

Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way.

The tomb the Living did enclose;

I saw Christ's glory as he rose!

The angels there attesting;

shroud with grave-clothes resting.

Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee.

That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know.

Victorious king, thy mercy show!

Alleluia, alleluia!

Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord..

GOSPEL Luke 24:1-12

On the first day of the week, at the first sign of dawn, the women went to the tomb with the spices they had prepared. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb, but on entering discovered that the body of the Lord Jesus was not there. As they stood there not knowing what to think, two men in brilliant clothes suddenly appeared at their side. Terrified, the women lowered their eyes. But the two men said to them, 'Why look among the dead for someone who is alive? He is not here; he is risen. Remember what he told you when he was still in Galilee: that the Son of Man had to be handed over into the power of sinful men and be crucified, and rise again on the third day?' And they remembered his words.

When the women returned from the tomb, they told all this to the Eleven and to all the others. The women were Mary of Magdala, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James. The other women with them also told the apostles, but this story of theirs seemed pure nonsense, and they did not believe them.

Peter, however, went running to the tomb. He bent down and saw the binding cloths, but nothings else; he then went back home, amazed at what had happened.
